Meeting the requirements for selection is no easy task. Swimmers need to be racing a wide range of strokes and varying distances which increase as a swimmers' age increases, so it's age appropriate. Swimmers receive XLR8 points (of which there is a minimum amount to achieve). These points are awarded based on results and placings in the swimmers' age group. The XLR8 programme recognises versatility and all round ability.

Evie is training with DSCB (Dunedin Swim Coaching Board) B Squad and Keira is training with the DSCB STMP Squad. Both swimmers represent the Taieri Swimming Club. It's great to see the continuation of Taieri College students achieving at high levels in swimming and receiving extra development opportunities to further grow and develop in their chosen sport. 
