Shinae competed in the Secondary Schools' Girls' triathlon and gained bronze in the Otago's and then also the South Island Secondary Schools' U19 girls grade. Shinae is also a leading team member of both the Senior A Girls' Basketball and Senior A Netball team. The A girls basketball team had a stunning year where they finished runners up in the Otago Secondary School Premier grade. For the Senior A netball side, Shinae is a top performing player, a former captain and has represented the team 78 times during her time at Taieri College.

Ben Baines - Ben has achieved great success in athletics on the national stage. At secondary school level he is the senior boys para shotput, discus and javelin champion. In gaining these titles he set new national records in the shotput and the javelin. At the New Zealand track and field champs Ben won the Men's F37 Javelin class, and set a new record of 33.44m which places him 6th in the world for 2021.
