

Uniform

With the cooler mornings, and cooler months coming, we are reminding all pupils that they are expected to wear our regulation school jacket over their uniform if they are going to wear a jacket.

We have a newly styled school jacket which is proving very popular due to its warmth and weather-proof qualities. Students with the previous style of jacket are still able to wear that version.

For senior students the school jacket is NOT a substitute for the blazer. During Term One and Term Four, the senior blazer is compulsory to be worn to assemblies and on formal occasions but it is optional at other times during these summer months. The senior blazer is required to be worn <u>at all times</u> during Term Two and Term Three.

In Terms Two and Three the jacket can be worn OVER the blazer when it is raining.

If students are wearing short sleeved Taieri College senior shirts or blouses and wish to wear polyprops, the polyprops should be plain white and have short sleeves.




Brainscape is a digital tool in which students can either make their own flashcards up or use sets of flashcards their teacher or other users have made.

To start they need to make a free account and then design their flashcards. When it comes to testing themselves, they will need to come up with the meaning for each term in their head, read the correct answer and then rate themselves 1-5 on how well they knew that term. Any term that they don't grade themselves a 5 for, will be repeated at some stage within the flashcard.



Year Seven Vision Screening

The Vision Hearing Technicians from Population Health team, Southern District Health will be visiting your school to screen all year seven students for distance vision on 25 May 2021.

• **Distance Vision (Amblyopia & Hyperopia)**This determines how well your child is able to see at a distance. It involves reading an eye chart. (This free vision check is not required if student wears glasses and/or is currently under care of an optometrist or eye specialist).

If you do not wish your child to be screened please fill out an opt-out slip, which are available at the school office before our visit.
