Literacy at Taieri College

In 2021, our college embarked on an ambitious project to boost reading and writing skills in every classroom. Last year we drew attention to the vocabulary skills of our students and looked to enhance student knowledge with various learning strategies. As we further embed this practice in 2022, we are now invested in building strong, confident, and engaged readers.

Why?

- Reading and writing are crucial skills needed to navigate a dynamic and ever-evolving world.
- A challenging and unpredictable future work environment requires people who can confidently communicate.
- NCEA is undergoing some rapid and major changes in how students are assessed -it's crucial our students are ready.
- Reading exercises cognitive strengths, particularly the empathy and creative portions of the brain. Additionally, other traits such as resilience, patience, well-being and general knowledge are all improved through the process of reading.

What are we doing?

- Developing and integrating vocabulary strategies into our classrooms.
- Increasing reading skills and strategies throughout subjects and curriculum areas.
- · Encouraging, promoting, and investing in reading.
- Providing opportunities for students to read in safe and supportive spaces.

Building a Community of Readers

- One goal we have is to build a community of readers at Taieri College.
- This will normalise and promote reading as an everyday and important part of life.
- Strengthening reading conversations between students, teachers, and whānau is crucial in building confident and competent readers.
- Providing reading role-models is a key step in driving this movement. Each teacher and our student leaders are sharing their reading stories and habits. We encourage you to do the same.
 As our National Library suggests: "Adolescents read more when they see adults and parents reading."
