Kia ora e te whanau

Welcome back to Term 3, where we usually look forward to lighter mornings and milder days. This week has certainly not been mild or dry! As we return from our holidays we emphasise the importance of re-establishing healthy and sustainable routines that lend themselves to positive outputs in the classroom. These routines may include good diet, regular exercise, enough sleep, and a monitoring of acceptable screen time.

Our senior students will be sitting exams at the start of September so the weeks leading up to them will be particularly important. They would have received their reports at the end of Term 2, and it would be wise to take on board the advice teachers have offered. The comments I have read on several reports offer specific guidance towards improving results and I challenge all senior students to respond accordingly during this term. Year 10 students will have now started their second semester of learning and will be adjusting to their new timetables. I hope they will enjoy the opportunity to explore a new range of learning opportunities for the second half of the year. Our Year 7-10 reports are currently being prepared and checked. They will be with families at the end of Week 3 and for Year 10 students will include the results from their first semester.

We made the decision at the start of this term to return to mask wearing while being inside. As expected, this generated a wide range of feedback, both for and against. I would like to state our rationale around our decision. Our seniors have very important exams coming up this term. To give them the best opportunity for success we want their specialised subject teachers in front of them. Term 2 was incredibly challenging for us in terms of staffing the school and dealing with regular absenteeism, both staff and students. There were days last term where we had up to 15 teachers absent from the classroom. The relief cost per day often exceeded \$3,000. On top of this, we were regularly asking teachers on full workloads to cover their colleagues' classes while they were away. Despite these circumstances we were still able to keep all year level classes running throughout Term 2. I understand the science around the effectiveness of mask use in viral transmission is fiercely debated but given the untenable challenges of last term we decided that anything that potentially stopped people getting sick was worth doing, particularly given its effect on the teaching and learning programmes we deliver to our students. Our students were at the heart of this decision.

Our second winter sports exchange takes place next week with a large contingent of students heading to Invercargill to compete against James Hargest on Wednesday. Good luck to everyone involved.

Teams will generally rotate around the various challenges and will have 60 minutes at each venue to tackle the task and score points for their overall team score.




Entries for the Illustrated Books section (if not in electronic format) can be delivered to the English Department Office in the last week of Term 3.

SHORT STORIES

Completed individually, this can be a story consisting of a minimum of 250 words. There should be a suitable title and formatted with paragraphs. The content may be a real experience, an adapted real experience, fiction, or inspired by other stories read or viewed. It does not have to come solely from a classroom activity.



This section is completed individually. Entries need a suitable title and written in paragraphs. Present your opinions about a subject such as Road Safety, Conservation, Social Media, Politics, etc. You could be aiming to persuade the reader to act/behave/think in a different way. Or you could present information about a subject such as Taieri history, animals, ancestry, your job, an historic event, etc. Entries may relate to some study you have completed. Entries do not have to come from classroom activities.



This may be a combined effort of up to two people (e.g. a text writer and an illustrator). Options include:

- (a) Children's Illustrated Book The book must be at least six pages long, but the page size is not restricted. It should be suitable for pre-school children to read or to have read to them. (i.e. the text and pictures may be quite simple).
- (b) Graphic Novel This text needs to be at least 15 frames, using the visual and written conventions of graphic novels (comic books, anime). Entries be a full story or the beginning of a longer narrative not yet written.



Completed individually, entries can be any length, rhymed or unrhymed. Very short poems, however, may not be judged as favorably as longer ones reflecting greater effort. Use a suitable title. The subject may be serious or humorous. It may be shaped on the page.



Collaborative efforts of up to three people may submit entries in this category. Drama scripts may be any length – a simple sketch or a piece of dialogue or monologue, and could contain one or several scenes. Stage directions must be included. It should be set out as a play script with dialogue and stage directions, as well as a captivating title.




