Kia ora e te whanau

It was a pleasure to present our 2022 Year 9 Scholarship recipients their awards this week. Once again, we have been impressed by the standard of applicants and I congratulate all the students who were successful. I would also like to recognise and acknowledge the students who weren't successful in their applications. We have a finite number of scholarships to award and not everyone is able to be successful in attaining them. My thanks to everyone who applied. The live audience who attended the ceremony included our prefects and older students who were past recipients of scholarships. It is our hope that the scholarships will be a springboard for these talented students to attain further accolades as they progress through Taieri College.

As of today, we have had 58 students advise us that they have tested positive for Covid-19. These students are spread across all year levels and don't appear to follow any pattern. We do ask that families advise us of positive cases as we are required to report this data to the Ministry of Education. Our message around illness remains the same, if you have flu like symptoms or are feeling unwell, please stay at home and get a Covid-19 test.

We also have several staff who have tested positive or are isolating as household contacts. This has put significant pressure on our relief teacher pool and our ability to have teachers in front of children. Whilst we are currently able to operate in relatively normal conditions, I do want to advise of some contingency plans we have in place should they be required. The first step of this contingency (depending on available staff) will be to potentially roster home particular year levels. This is becoming standard practice in schools across New Zealand who have had high staff absences. While we haven't had to take this option yet, please be aware that it may be an option we explore in the future. All communications around these steps will be emailed.


