The freezer door certainly opened this week with some frosty mornings. Despite the cold, our annual South Otago High School sports exchange still went ahead on Wednesday. Junior sports were played in Mosgiel, and our seniors went to Balclutha. I travelled to Balclutha and enjoyed watching our Senior A netball, 1st XV rugby and 1st XI football teams. The Senior A's won convincingly, our 1st XV showed great character to score late in the second half to draw with a much bigger South Otago team, and our footballers dominated with a 10-1 victory. Murray Boyne was the standout with six goals! All games were played in excellent spirit, and I congratulate all students who participated and pridefully represented Taieri College. My thanks also to the teachers, managers, coaches, and our sports department for making the day such a success.

Our student council organised a mufti day this week that coincided with Octocan. Octacan is Presbyterian Support Otago's major winter food drive and supports many local people through the colder months. Kai for Octacan is the 'harvest', when food is gathered for those in our community who are grappling with the impact of hardship, and find they need the support of the Family Works Foodbank. Once again, our students have responded well to the challenge of helping our community, by donating around 1550 cans to the Foodbank. Thanks to everyone for their generosity.

During the week primary teachers settled, but secondary teachers are still undertaking industrial action. This continuing action is in response to the government's disappointing collective agreement offer which was rejected by the PPTA. Taieri College has no control over this action as it is organised by the PPTA. The industrial action planned for the next 2 weeks is as follows;

Tuesday 13 June – Year 9 and 13 students rostered home
Wednesday 14 June – Year 10 and 11 students rostered home
Thursday 15 June – Year 12 and 13 students rostered home

Tuesday 20 June – Year 11 and 12 students rostered home
Wednesday 21 June – Year 13 and 9 students rostered home

Further industrial action is being planned. We will make you aware of this as the term progresses.











Pasifika Voices

On Wednesday 7 June at Otago Boys' High School, the Otago Secondary Schools' Pacific Island Speech Competitions were held. In 2018 the first Pasifika Voices Competition started at Otago Girls' High School. This event is student led and gives Pacific Island students a voice where they can speak about their culture and their language. Twenty Pacific Island students participated from schools around Otago. The competition is split into three sections. One section is for students speaking in their mother tongue, another section is for junior students in Year 9-10 with the subject 'It is important to protect our culture as it is the foundation of our identity' and a senior section (Year 11-13) with their subject being 'If you want to go fast, go alone; If you want to go far, go together'.

While Taieri College didn't have any speakers participate in the competition, a small group of Pacific Island students from our school went along to watch with Miss Tuhega (Kaitiaki – Teacher in charge of Māori and Pasifika students.

Miss Tuhega said "It was inspiring to hear our local Pacific Island students speak from their heart and what their culture meant to them.



Otago Secondary Schools' Swimming Championships

Just over seventy Otago secondary school students competed from nineteen secondary schools throughout Otago at the annual Otago Secondary Schools' Swimming Championships at Moana Pool in Dunedin on Sunday 28 May 2023.

It was a fast-paced session of racing, with a whopping nineteen championship records set. While there were many experienced racers present, there were also some students who were new to the competitive swimming scene, which was fantastic to see!

Taieri College were one of nineteen representative schools with eight swimmers competing this year. Our team consisted of Emma Bain (12JN), Keira Hughes (11LO), Joel McGrath (9MI), Regan McGrath (10NI), Emily Russell (11BK), Abby Samuels (11FS), Barrett Smart (9FR) and Laura Thomas (11SP).

With the age groups split only two ways its always tough competing against the older swimmers. Most of our fifteen and over swimmers were competing with the sixteen-and seventeen-year-olds and our two year nine boys were up against the fourteen-year-old boys, as well as their own age.

Our best results were as follows:

15 and Over Females

Emma Bain – 3rd 50m Freestyle, 100m Individual Medley 2nd, 50m Butterfly 3rd, 100m Butterfly 2nd, 50m Backstroke 2nd, 100m Freestyle 2nd.

Keira Hughes – 1st 100m Individual Medley, 1st 100m Butterfly, 1st 200m Butterfly and new PB.

Emily Russell – 6th 50m Backstroke.

Abby Samuels – 1st 50m Freestyle, 2nd 50m Butterfly, 1st 100m Freestyle.

Laura Thomas – 5th 100m Individual Medley and 5th 100m Freestyle and a PB in 50m Freestyle.

15 and Over Males

Regan McGrath – 5th 100m Individual Medley and a new PB in 50m Breaststroke.

14 and under Males

Joel McGrath – 4th 100m Backstroke and two new PBs in 50m Breaststroke and 100m Freestyle. Barrett Smart – 5th 100m Breaststroke and 5th 100m Freestyle.

Relay Results

Relays were open age groups.

We entered a team in the MIXED 200m Freestyle relay and the MIXED 200m Medley relay. Results were the same for both relays.

The Taieri College A relay team consisting of Emma Bain, Keira Hughes, Regan McGrath, and Abby Samu<mark>els</mark> placed second to a tight Dunstan 4 NAG swimmer relay team.

The Taieri College B relay team consisting of Joel McGrath, Emily Russell, Laura Thomas, and Barrett Smart fought hard to place fourth in these relays.

We would like to personally thank Tony McGrath for stepping up the night before to take on the Team Manager role when Mrs Hughes went down with Covid. Thank you for managing these students and we hear you thoroughly enjoyed it. A special thanks to Stacey Smart, Tarryn McGrath and Aimee Samuels for time-keeping at this event. Without the ongoing support to run meets they would not be possible. Thanks again to Swimming Otago for organising this fabulous event for our swimmers to enjoy and Grassroots Trust for supporting this competition.

Over the course of the programme, students will be working in the field and lab, leading their own marine science team project while being mentored by postgraduate students, and staying overnight at the beautiful residency of Quarantine Island. This programme is also an ideal extension for those who have participated in previous NZMSC programmes.


