#### **Prefect Reading**

Kia Ora Koutou. Welcome everyone to the first senior assembly of Term Three. I am Emily, one of your academic prefects for this year and today I am going to talk to you about something I'm sure you have heard many times before, and that is resilience.

Resilience is the ability to bounce back in the face of difficult challenges. As a high school student, you may be faced with any number of tough issues. These can range from academic, to sports, to arts, to skills challenges. This term we have several large events coming up including senior practice exams, the Taieri College Production, as well as tournament week. The pressure to perform may be extremely intimidating for many of you, especially for those who may be sitting NCEA exams for the first time or competing in your first tournament.



Throughout these next few weeks, you may experience a setback or a failure. This may be any number of things such as forgetting your lines midperformance, getting a disappointing grade, or throwing the ball away in a big game. This may make you want to give up or try less at the next attempt out of the fear of failing a second time. However, it is not your failures that define you, rather your ability to pick yourself up and start over. The best player on the rugby field has dropped the ball a thousand times but picks themselves up over and over again until they score that try. In the classroom, having resilience and pushing through a difficult task may be the difference between a "Not Achieved" grade and an "Excellence". It can take up to 10,000 hours of work to perfect a skill, so do don't expect to be a master on the first attempt. Instead, have resilience and persevere until you get it. This may be after the second, third, or hundredth attempt. Throughout this term I urge you to have resilience, whether that be in the classroom, on the stage, or on the sports field.

Before I finish, I want to leave you with this quote from Henry Ford, industrialist, and founder of Ford Motor Company: "Failure is simply the opportunity to begin again." Before you think about giving up, think about what would happen if you were to succeed. Thank you.

#### Rook Peak - Into the Top 30!



A massive congratulations to Keira Wallace and Kate Aitken – also known as Rook Peak – for making it into the top 30 acts in Aotearoa. The national finals will be made up of 7 bands and 3 solo/duo artists. A new judging panel will now review the top 30 videos and make the final choices for the Top 10. The top 30 acts are made up of 20 bands and 10 solo/duo acts, so this puts Rook Peak in the top 10 solo/duo acts in the country – quite an accomplishment!

Each of the top 30 acts gets to record of one of their songs at a professional local recording studio. This is their chance to get familiar with what it's like to be in a professional studio, to ask questions and to gain knowledge to take into their future recordings, as well as have a song they can use afterwards!

The acts are also provided with media mentoring with Sarah Gandy, a hugely experienced industry professional and media specialist, will host a series of live online workshops. She is putting together three workshops (each of which will be offered three times) tailor-made for young acts finding their feet in the music industry. The workshops will be focused on publicity, media skills, and online content. These workshops will be an awesome place to upskill - not just for music, but also for life.

Each of these opportunities has been crafted to empower the acts not only as musicians, but also as leaders in their own right. These opportunities are designed to set the successful acts up with skills to take into their future and help open even more doors for them.

Once again, a huge congratulations. The Taieri College community is immensely proud of your achievements!

#### Message from the Physical Education and Hea<mark>lth Department on PE Gear on a Mufti Day</mark>

If you are in Years 7 to 11 and have a practical Physical Education lesson, you are required to wear the approved school PE uniform (see below). If you are in Year 12 or Year 13 appropriate alternative sportswear should be worn. We have these regulations in place to promote healthy hygiene practice when participating in physical activity at the college.

#### Approved Physical Education uniform.

- Year 7-11 school sports top and school shorts.
- Year 12,13 appropriate gear suitable for physical activity.
- Additional items of uniform.
  - Plain black or navy track pants.
  - Taieri College Sports Hoodies (over PE top).
  - Plain black or navy polypropylenes/thermals.
  - Plain black or navy bike shorts (under PE shorts).
- Footwear:
  - Bare feet are permissible indoors.
  - Appropriate non-marking sports shoes.
  - Normal school uniform socks are not to be worn in Physical Education.

#### Young Writers' Awards 2023

#### Entries are due Wednesday 20 September at 3:00pm.

Entries need to be e-mailed as a Word document attachment to <a href="ywa@taieri.school.nz">ywa@taieri.school.nz</a>. The subject line must indicate the category and year level.

Entries for the Illustrated Books section (if not in electronic format) can be delivered to the English Department Office in the last week of Term 3.

### SHORT STORIES

Completed individually, this can be a story consisting of a minimum of 250 words. There should be a suitable title and formatted with paragraphs. The content may be a real experience, an adapted real experience, fiction, or inspired by other stories read or viewed. It does not have to come solely from a classroom activity.



This section is completed individually. Entries need a suitable title and written in paragraphs. Present your opinions about a subject such as Road Safety, Conservation, Social Media, Politics, etc. You could be aiming to persuade the reader to act/behave/think in a different way. Or you could present information about a subject such as Taieri history, animals, ancestry, your job, an historic event, etc. Entries may relate to some study you have completed. Entries do not have to come from classroom activities.



This may be a combined effort of up to two people (e.g. a text writer and an illustrator). Options include:
(a) Children's Illustrated Book - The book must be at least six pages long, but the page size is not restricted. It should be suitable for pre-school children to read or to have read to them. (i.e. the text and pictures may be quite simple).
(b) Graphic Novel – This text needs to be at least 15 frames, using the visual and written conventions of graphic novels (comic books, anime). Entries be a full story or the beginning of a longer narrative not yet written.



Completed individually, entries can be any length, rhymed or unrhymed. Very short poems, however, may not be judged as favorably as longer ones reflecting greater effort. Use a suitable title. The subject may be serious or humorous. It may be shaped on the page.



Collaborative efforts of up to three people may submit entries in this category. Drama scripts may be any length – a simple sketch or a piece of dialogue or monologue, and could contain one or several scenes. Stage directions must be included. It should be set out as a play script with dialogue and stage directions, as well as a captivating title.


