Level 2 Biology and Geography Trip to Aoraki Mt Cook

2024.

Last week, 55 students took part in the annual trip to Mt Cook to study the impact of tourism on Aoraki Mt Cook National Park, and how these impacts are being managed.

After leaving Wednesday morning, we had some short stops at both Hampden and Loch Laird (by Benmore Dam) before arriving at Mt Cook Village around 3.00pm. Two groups then alternated between an introductory talk by the DoC education ranger, and field work analysing the impact on vegetation from desire lines (shortcuts taken by walkers), on the Hooker Valley track. We then returned to Glentanner for the night, under clear skies to cook our own dinners, and socialise.

The next day we returned to Mt Cook village in the morning for two presentations by DoC. The first involved visiting the services area of the village where we learnt about how DoC deal with rubbish and sewage as well as learning about the water supply, flood protection, and revegetation systems. The other talk occurred at the Visitor Centre and painted the issues facing the National Park over the next ten years and options being considered to deal with these. Before lunch we all regrouped and sampled the first of our sites to investigate the nature of the vegetation in the Hooker Valley. After lunch, half of the students were taken to the airport, and they took a flight on a ski plane up the Tasman Valley and over the glacier in a ski plane. Unfortunately, the weather was windy, and we couldn't land on the glacier, but all the mountains were clear including Mt Cook. She was a little bumpy though! The other group carried on up the famous Hooker Valley walk sampling vegetation on the way before making it to the awesome Hooker Lake with all its icebergs. Many students took a dip in the 0.7°C water. Before returning again to Glentanner for the night, a dozen students and a couple of teachers tackled the tough Red Tarns hike which rises over 300 metre in 1.3km!

On the last day, the group visited the Tasman Valley under cloudy skies. Since we couldn't see the mountains, we didn't look at the glaciated landscape features but did some field work analysing track widening – a negative impact from having too many tourists on tracks. The glacier explorer group then left to take part in a one-hour jet boat trip on the Tasman Glacier terminal lake, where they learnt about glaciation, the formation of the mountains, ice bergs and took in some awesome views. The other group walked the Hooker Valley up to the lake. Just after lunch we then made our way home some five hours later. A big thank you to Mr Hackfath, and Mrs Knowles for their hard work and support as well as Kym from Iconic Tours.

Otago Primary School Swimming Champs

On Sunday 7 April 2024, Swimming Otago hosted the inaugural Otago Primary Schools' Swimming Championships at Moana Pool. There were 79 schools from throughout Otago represented and approximately 390 swimmers competing in 50m Freestyle, 50m Backstroke, 50m Breaststroke, a freestyle age group relay and a medley mixed age group relay. All swimmers had to make qualifying times to enter this meet. SIX Otago Primary School records were broken on Sunday.

Mrs Hughes arrived early to get us seats and by 9.00am the grandstand was packed with swimmers, parents, grandparents, and other supporters. Warm up started at 9.30am; it was like sardines swimming in a can and most of us left at the conclusion of the meet around 3.00pm.

The first event was the 50m Freestyle through all the age groups. Following on from this were the age group freestyle relays, followed by the 50m backstroke and then the 50m breaststroke.

Taieri College had nine students who chose to compete with their qualifying times. The team consisted of Nash Gilmour (8WO), Charlie Clements (8WO), Tom Taylor (8VL), Isabel McHoull (8WO) who also made up our 12 Year old freestyle relay team. George Van der Water, Alyssa Hughes, Zoe Schiller and Mila Plew made up our 11 Year old relay team. In addition to this Ryan Van Tuel qualified and was a part of the team but sadly sustained an injury just prior to this meet, so he had to scratch from his events.

The Mixed 12 and over freestyle relay team placed 5th and our Mixed 11 Year old relay team placed ninth. The medley relay team consisted of George Van der Water, Charlie Clements, Nash Gilmour, and Tom Taylor who placed seventh.

Mila Plew received a PB from one of her two events, Isabel McHoull received a PB for her only individual event. Charlie Clements, Alyssa Hughes, Zoe Schiller, George Van der Water all got two PBs from three events. Whilst, Tom Taylor and Nash Gilmour got three PBs from all three events. The best performance/results came from Nash Gilmour who placed fourth in the 50m Breaststroke with a whopping five second PB and placed sixth in his 50m Freestyle with a three second PB and another sixth in his backstroke with a 2 second PB. His performance at this meet was exceptional, with his best results of the swimming season to date. Well done and congratulations Nash! Charlie Clements also made a top eight final result in the 50m Breaststroke with a two second PB. Well done Charlie!

Mrs Hughes would like to extend a big thank you to the wonderfully supportive parents on the day, but would like to make special mention to Jo Bridge who volunteered to marshall the 380 swimmers for this meet. Special thanks to Kim Schiller, and Marcelle Clements for timekeeping on lane five for the entire length of the session, and Toni McHoull and Jenna Van der Water for doing the programme sales. Your assistance is very much appreciated to help run these successful events. We look forward to another successful year, next year! Well done swimmers, keep up the hard work.

For the Tuakana Award, there is a substantial Scholarship attached for either study at Otago University or at Otago Polytechnic.

Careers Chat

As usual we have enjoyed a first term that has kept us very active, especially the number of exciting trips that students have enjoyed and plenty of students calling in for careers assistance. It is hard to believe that our students have completed nearly a third of their academic year!

Next term we will continue our quick interviews with Year 13 students and follow this up with a quick careers chat with all our Year 12 students. We will then run some follow up sessions, targeting earliest those who are still very unsure of career pathway options.

Next term we have the Careers Expo and Tertiary Inf<mark>ormation Day in May, (details below) These are important opportunities to keep gathering information on potential career pathways and plans.</mark>

We will also have our Gateway students all getting out regularly with their respective business mentors and we will be working to organise some work experience for a wider group of our Year 12 and 13 students early in Term 2.

We will continue to offer more **short courses for our senior students**, and these will mostly be half subsidised by the STAR budget. These are advertised in the notices and students register at the careers office (you are welcome to email me directly to register), with confirmation of enrolment requiring a permission form and payment to the school office. **Anyone with financial hardship can contact us directly to discuss options**.

Learners Drivers Licence Workshop Day at school (complete this to make sure you will pass the theory test), you need to book and pay for your test independently, but you can book to sit it very soon after the workshop. Courses running Thursdays 20 June 2024 and 19 September 2024. If anyone requires a reader writer, they can also register for a full two-day workshop that includes sitting your test.

The Learning Place (based in Princess St) - **Barista, Bartending, Security**, plus other courses available. These courses are available regularly throughout the year, especially school holidays.

Mainland Driving School - forklift driving course - will be a course Term 2 and Term 3 2024.

Lifecare - comprehensive workplace first aid training, based at school Tuesday 17 September 2024.


