Cooler weather approaching?

When the weather is inclement and jackets are needing to be worn, the Taieri College jacket is the jacket to be worn to and from school as well as around school.







Otago Regional Schools' Debating Championships

The Otago Regional Schools' Debating Cham<mark>pionships were held at the University of Otago's Hunter</mark> Centre on the 9-10 March 2024, with seventeen teams attending. It was a very high-quality competition.

The first part of the competition is the preliminary rounds where teams had thirty minutes to prepare their cases for the following moots:

- This House would ban private schools.
- This House believes that private charities should focus on reducing global poverty over climate change.
- This House, as New Zealand, would restrict the rights of Australian citizens, where Australia restricts the rights of New Zealand citizens. (For example, through removing access to welfare and student loans and the deportation of criminals).
- A potion has been invented which can permanently stop you from falling in love. This House
 would take the potion.
- The Football Ferns national football team is competing in a major international football
 competition. At halftime, they are up 6-0 against a team from Samoa. The Samoan team's loss will
 end their tournament. This House, as the Football Ferns, would let the team from Samoa score a
 consolation goal.
- This House believes that the feminist movement should actively oppose the use of makeup.

At the end of the preliminary rounds, Taieri College had four wins and two narrow losses. This placed us second equal with five other teams. Breaking into the semi-finals meant that it came down to overall speaker points... and we did it! For the first time in Taieri College Debating history, we made it into a senior debating competition championship round.

Up against the top team in the tournament, we faced Columba College on the topic of:
The 'Hollywood Blockbuster model' refers to a business model employed by major Hollywood studios whereby studios opt to heavily fund a small number of films each year as opposed to distributing that funding more equally across a larger number of films. This House supports the Hollywood Blockbuster model.

Unfortunately, we fell to Columba in the semi-finals who did go on to win the tournament against King's High School.

At the prize giving, Taieri College earned many accolades:

Aahana Mundamattam (Year 10) and Jenny Petegem Thach (Year 11) were both named to the Otago Kororā Development Squad. They will receive additional training and coaching from the University of Otago Debating Society.

Joanne Brock-Smith (Year 13) deservingly received the Best Style Award for her commanding speaking style as a talented third speaker. Then to top off the evening, Joanne was also named to the Otago Region Debating Squad as a reserve and will travel to Wellington at the end of May to compete in the national competition.





Earlier this week, our Year 10 Art students were given a challenge: Using just tape, recycled cardboard, and plastic rolls they had to create a modern Wharenui on our grounds. This 'living sculpture' had to be completed in just one hour, and involved cooperation, creativity, and technical construction skills.







Congratulations to Nash Gilmour (8WO) who was announced as the Under 12 Most Valuable Player in 2023. This is a super achievement, well done Nash!


